Parish Council Report - November 2022

The Parish Council met on 7th November

Public Time

No members of the public attended.

Churchyard & Cemetery

The area in the cemetery behind the tree in the centre has been mown and the grass raked up. It now needs to be scarified ready for seeding. The area behind the Church where the more recent graves are, was discussed, and it was agreed that this would be cut next year and not be part of the rewilding area.

Speeding in and through the Village

All speed signs are fully operational and functioning well.

Playing Field / Playground

The temporary bolt fix in the carriage of the zip wire had been replaced with a permanent repair.

Cllr Blackmore has overseen the full table tennis installation; the Council has noted many positive responses and thanks for this facility. The table tennis company have provided some basic bats and balls. Cllr Blackmore will build a holder attached to the table to store these for all to use.

Details of the installation of the adult exercise equipment is included in an article in this issue.

The custom-made picnic table donated by the Grunseid Family has been installed and pictures sent to the family. It has been engraved with Kurt Krunseid's favourite turn of phrase "it was alright......here KG 1933-2022". A great addition to the play area.

Planning

No new applications or decisions have been received.

Financial Update

The quarterly review July-September 2022 has been carried out with the oversight of Cllr Guttridge, the report is available on the woodnewtonhub website. Budget-to-actual remained inline and on target and all reconciliations were in order.

Allotments

A leaking tap had been reported and added to the job list for the village clean-up day, all four taps were checked but no leak found.

The Parish Council wishes to thank Robert Bellairs for organising some top-grade manure for the allotment holders, who were most grateful. We would also like to thank Mr Bierton who delivered the manure and at the same time, pushed up the bonfire into an orderly heap to burn later.

Mr.B THE BEEKEEPER by Ian Blackburn



I have been a beekeeper for 7 years now having been intrigued about the ecology of this social insect since being a young lad. It all started out as a visit to a hive with a beekeeper who was a friend of an acquaintance of mine. This quickly turned into a birthday gift of a bee suit, equipment and a training course with the Cambridge Bee Keeping Association. It was very much an eye opener and whilst I now say



to people I am a seasoned beekeeper I am no expert and the bees still keep me on my toes. No matter how many times I think I have mastered beekeeping they suddenly do something unexpected and back to square one I go.

Beekeeping has been many things; social, fun, fascinating, surprising, practical, educational as well as frustrating, alarming and depressing but I have no regrets about getting into the second oldest profession in the world.

Beekeeping is not as niche as you may think and I have now met countless people who have links with or who are interested in this hobby. A casual conversion usually leads to more in depth discussions about the plight of bees and/or questions about where to buy honey, where to get taster days, how to deal with a swarm in my garden, or how do I start



beekeeping? I have now mentored three local beekeepers over the last few years.

I can't say I was a big fan of honey back in the beginning but now enjoy this gift the bees supply me. I have found lots of fun things you can do with honey and its by-products. Honey is great in cooking from honey dressings and marinades to yummy spiced honey cake. I have also made honey rum which is a great winter tipple and use the wax to occasionally produce candles, hand cream, lip balms & furniture polish. I'm currently melting some wax down for an archer for waxing bowstrings and wax blocks/combs for a jeweller who uses it in the creation of some fantastic jewellery.

Woodnewton Playground Upgrade 2022

For many years Woodnewton has benefited from a comprehensive and popular range of infant and junior playground equipment but the Parish Council were concerned that there were limited outdoor facilities suitable for adults. As councillor responsible for the playground, Paul Blackmore was asked to lead a project to establish what equipment might be suitable, a budget for providing these new facilities and what grants might be available to help with the expenditure.





Various ideas were considered and it was finally agreed that the preference was for an outdoor table tennis table with all weather base plus a range of outdoor adult gym equipment. Paul then worked with members of the village table tennis club and Kay Franklin, a personal trainer based in Woodnewton, to develop detailed plans for the project. Potential suppliers were contacted to provide costs for products that matched the specifications and a small team reviewed installations in neighbouring villages to decide on the preferred providers.





Village residents were asked whether they supported the addition of these new faculties as part of a comprehensive online survey conducted in 2021 and a large majority were in agreement so the scheme was approved by the Parish Council late in the summer of 2021.

Paul then worked with the Augean Community Fund and GrantScape to create a suitable grant application which was submitted in October 2021 and finally approved in April 2022. Suppliers were immediately contacted and orders placed, but due to "post covid" materials and manpower shortages the installation was only finally completed in November. However Woodnewton now has many superb new additions to the facilities at the playing fields ready for when the sunshine returns.

Just a village-based Challenge this year, we raised £130 for Parkinson's UK; every penny contributed goes towards funding the on-going research, better treatments &, eventually, a cure.

Meanwhile, last year's winner, Brian Anson, has a message ... "I'm after you Henry!"


