Communicare News

At the general patients' meeting held on 7th March, guest speaker Dr Sundeep Odedra chaired a discussion on Type 1 & 2 Diabetes. Many attendees suffered from the condition and raised questions relating to symptoms, diet and self management. Increasing numbers of people are developing the condition partially due to lifestyle choices and 10% of the health budget is taken up with treatment of diabetes and its associated complications. The are 3.5 million people in the UK affected by diabetes with an annual estimated increase of 200,000. Type 1 tends to affect younger people and is often due to genetics and numbers are relatively static. Type 2 is typically found in older age groups where obesity contributes to the alarming increase in numbers but obesity is also a trigger for the increasing instances in children.

Maintaining good health and fitness are important in avoiding or delaying the onset of Type 2. Diet and exercise are the key and the earlier in life a better regime is adopted the better. While research may in time result in better solutions there is currently no sign of a cure. Dr Odedra encouraged all patients to seek early advice if they showed any symptoms as it was often possible to halt the onset of the disease by changes to diet and life routines.

Dr Takhar gave an update on the new project at Kings Cliffe. Unfortunate news had just been received that, due to the financial situation, Northamptonshire County Council had decided that the KC site has to be placed on the open market. Negotiations had been ongoing with the Council but, although all parties were strongly in favour of the project, no preferential treatment could be given and transparency was paramount in the outcome. Drs Takhar and Nally have been attending various local village parish council meetings to give presentations on the project.

Dr Takhar confirmed that discussions were taking place with Peterborough City Hospital regarding the proposed development at Wansford surgery to identify the type of service the unit would provide. This is likely to be post-operative recovery.

On the Plot - Almost

During the coming few months the Parish Council have decided that we should develop a small area of the playing field into a wildflower meadow. The area chosen is that under the trees that were planted a few years ago in the top left hand corner of the field, immediately next to allotment plots. The aim is to improve that area for the benefit of the village and also to make an area that should be especially attractive to birds, insects and wildlife in general.



The area measures about 20m x 13m and is roughly rectangular. It is planned to sow the whole plot and to also to make a winding pathway through it, thus allowing access for everyone to be able to see things close at hand. We have been in regular contact with a company called Pictorial Meadows, based in Sheffield and have have been given much helpful advice by them. It has been agreed that we will sow a perennial wildflower mix in the autumn

which means that once established, reseeding

annually will not be necessary.

During the next few months we intend to hire a turf cutter and remove the turf from the area concerned. The exposed soil will then be roughly cultivated but left bare. Over the summer and early autumn pernicious weeds that appear and that might easily out-compete our sowings will be removed so that by the time we are ready to sow the mix, we should have a relatively clean site.



We should be able to sow the area in late October and it will probably be a good idea to place temporarily around the site a low fence to protect what has been done. We will remove this as soon as the plants get reasonably well established.

hope that the preparation, sowing and eventual maintenance of the area will be an enjoyable undertaking. There will obviously be quite an intensive period of work getting the site prepared and sown and I am hoping that there will be some willing to volunteer to help with this. I plan to provide updates in my usual column and so if you feel you might like to help out that will be the place to look to check on arrangements.
