Parish Council Report – August 2018 The Parish Council met on 6th August Call Connect Bus Update

The following update has been received from ENC;

'I am pleased to report that your village will retain a CallConnect from Monday 3rd September. This is without funding from East Northants or yourselves as an affected parish council. However, it should be noted that Lincolnshire have stated that the fares charged within Northants and between Northants and Stamford / Peterborough will most likely rise in due course. Woodnewton will retain a Monday – Saturday service serving Stamford & Peterborough.

Councillor Vacancies

Cllr Liz Holland attended her final Council meeting in August. Liz will be sorely missed having been involved for many years, initially as Clerk and subsequently as Councillor and Vice-Chair. Liz has made a huge contribution to village life and her financial expertise has been a great asset to the Council, which we have greatly appreciated. The Council recorded a vote of thanks to Liz in recognition of all her work.

As the Council was 1 member short anyway we now have 2 vacancies for new Councillors to join us. The Council meets 12 times per year and aims to maintain the Village, encourage community effort and take account of the views and needs of Woodnewton residents. It is not an onerous task in a small village like ours but it is an important one. Parish Councils are the first tier in our democracy and where residents have the most direct impact on issues affecting their community. Without enough members the Council cannot function and we effectively give up representation to the District Council.

Wansford & Kings Cliffe Practice IMPORTANT ANNOUNCEMENT FOR PATIENTS - FLU JABS

We will be commencing our influenza vaccination campaign in September 2018. We will be running various walk-in clinics at both Wansford and Kings Cliffe as well as pre-bookable appointments.

Due to demand NHS England have restricted delivery of the vaccines so we have had to plan our flu clinics very carefully. With this in mind here are the planned flu clinic dates:

Walk-in clinics at both Wansford and Kings Cliffe on Saturday 15th September between 9am and 12noon. Note: if you attend the Wansford Walk-in clinic you may use any of the three car-parks. Do not be put off by the crowds!

We will be having two nurses at each site and each jab takes one minute so we can get through a lot in this time. Please have bare arms at the ready!

Bookable clinics every day during weeks commencing 1.10.18 and 29.10.18 at a mixture of both sites.

Please be pro-active and check with the surgery during September for further information and advice about eligibility.

On the Plot

It cannot be denied that we have had a glorious summer. The extreme heat and lack of rainfall over a number of weeks has certainly resulted in some crops thriving, but most wilting and finding some difficulty in surviving, never mind being productive.

For those with the required energy, watering has been a regular job. There is little doubt that if

you once start watering vegetables it is best to keep on doing so. I have tried to restrict mine to those plants that seem to benefit most. There is little doubt that I have kept them going, but I am sure that the end result will not be as good as if we had had useful rainfall at regular intervals.

Whatever, all years prove to be a challenge in one way or another and I am sure that I have had much to be pleased about over the season. Hopefully you have too.

As I look back I certainly start to think about my approach next year and with this, what I shall grow.

I came across the RHS app recently and thought that you might like to look at it. You can find it under 'RHS' in the App store and in the equivalent Android store. It is free and allows you initially to select the type of crops that you intend to, or actually do grow. Each crop is then explained fully in the appropriate section of the app, giving such details as planting, harvesting, common problems and recommended varieties.

In a section entitled 'tasks' you are given recommended jobs that need to be carried out in the chosen month for the crop you are considering.

In a section entitled 'Discovery' you can find out information about, for example, no-dig methods, raised beds and herbs and flowers.

I certainly think it is worth a look especially, perhaps, if you are new to growing vegetables and fruit and feel that there is a lot to cope with.

I know at least one person who will be sitting in his shed getting the information needed to pull one over on the rest of us next year - that's if he can get a signal!

Leaders and governors have successfully addressed the actions from the last inspection. They have ensured that the standard of education at the school is securely good.	Standards of attainment and rates of progress in reading, writing and mathematics have improved in almost all year groups. Progress is especially strong in the current Year 6.
The governing body has undergone significant improvement. Governors provide effective challenge and support for leaders.	The teaching of phonics has improved recently. An increasing proportion of pupils is on track to achieve at the expected standard in the Year 1 phonics screening check.
The curriculum is broad and balanced. Parents and carers appreciate the wide range of extracurricular activities provided for their children.	The presentation of pupils' work in their books, and their standards of handwriting, are not consistently good.
