

Woodnewton Parish Council

Parish Council Report - July & August 2019

The Council met on Monday 1st July and August 5th

Street Lights:

Council agreed the plan for the street lights. After taking advice from a municipal lighting specialist it was decided that key lights on bends and junctions will be 18w and most of the remainder 12w. Between 12.00pm and 5.00am all lights will be dimmed with the majority of lights 50% dimmed. This plan should reduce our electricity usage by 68%. We have applied to the secretary of state to borrow £3,850 to part fund the street-lighting upgrade project.

Playing Field:

The recent ROSPA independent safety inspection was received. There are no high risk items and the recent maintenance work undertaken by the Council was noted.

Speeding

The Council has looked into the options for speeding signs. In the short term it may be possible to borrow a sign from Northamptonshire Highways. To purchase a sign will cost between £1500 - £2500 depending on the type of sign chosen. It is also possible to fit the sign with a data logger that records speeds. This may provide useful evidence in the future should the Council want to change speed limits for example. To erect the sign Council will need to obtain a Section 50 licence at a cost of £300.

Planning

In July one application was returned with 'No Comment'. The ENC Enforcement Officer reported that there was No Evidence of a Breach of Rules regarding another Planning Consent. Two applications were considered in August with no objections.

CallConnect Buses

Lincolnshire County Council will be stopping the CallConnect service to Oundle on 2 Sept but services to Stamford and Peterborough from Woodnewton will continue

Obstruction to Pavements

Would residents and their visitors be more considerate when parking and not park on the pavement. Please also ensure that vegetation overhanging from your property does not force pedestrians to use the roadway.

August 2019 Report

The June quarterly general patients meeting had a good attendance with a talk and demonstration of both CPR and a defibrillator by Sarah-Jane Turner. It was particularly appropriate as so many local villages have installed this emergency equipment.

On the officials' recommendation, it was agreed that funds should be provided to purchase a 24 hour ambutory blood pressure machine for use by the practice at a total cost of £1110. A paediatric probe with handheld oximeter for use at the Kings Cliffe surgery had also been requested, but it was decided to delay this purchase until further funds became available.

Dr Takhar updated us on the new National Primary Care Network due to formally be introduced in this area last month – details of the final arrangements will be reported at the next meeting. He also reported on the work of the surgery's research team – following a request, six patients had volunteered to join a research panel working in conjunction with Cambridge University on the use of anti-depressants.

Dr Takhar was congratulated on the recent invitation with his wife to a garden party at Buckingham Palace – he was nominated for services and work within the NHS.

The practice and pharmacy were also congratulated on winning the GP Partnership of the Year category which acknowledges development and sharing information and ideas between practice and pharmacy teams and is sponsored by NAPP (see last month).

Self-Care was suggested as a topic for a future meeting covering emphasis placed on patients to purchase certain over-the-counter drugs rather than expecting provision by the NHS, saving up to £6M each year.

It was noted that Mrs Wagstaffe will be tendering her resignation as Chairperson at the forthcoming AGM next month (see above) although she will remain as an official, continuing organization of social group activities. Dr Nally will be giving a talk on the very topical subject of mental health at the AGM

The next social group coffee morning is on Friday 13th September at the Kings Cliffe Active Hall 10.0am. Woodnewton Cinema



Farewell to David Webb and Jill Roche.


A large number of friends, including many members of the Woodnewton Players, said farewell to David Webb and Jill Roche on 10 August at the village Hall.

The costs of the magazine are met from donations and advertising with periodic assistance in grants for equipment and software from the Lottery. The compilation, editing, production and delivery is carried out by volunteers. Recently printing costs have gone up considerably. Coleman's, our wonderful printers had actually held our printing prices for several years and recently had to increase them to cover their costs. We have also noticed a drop off in advertisers and you will notice this month that we only have 6 adverts in the issue.

The team at the News have been discussing whether it is time to take the publication into the digital age, accessing the News via the Woodnewton Hub website. We believe that this would serve most people's needs but for the people who do want a paper copy we will offer that as an alternative. This would mean our printing costs would be much reduced and we could also use simpler and less costly software to prepare each issue.

We would prepare a monthly edition which would be hosted on the website with a dedicated page for each month, easily accessible by computer or smartphone. We are also in the process of creating a What's On page on the website and a more comprehensive directory of local services.

Our plan is to work towards the new digital approach to launch with our January 2020 edition. We have some hurdles to get over including ensuring that whatever we do is compliant with the GDPR data protection laws. We would, for example, have to have your email addresses so that we can let you know when it's ready.


