Parish Council Report - January 2022

The Parish Council met on 10th January.

Public Time

No members of the public attended.

Speed Cameras

Thanks to the hard work of Cllr Swallow who successfully completed the grant funding application, three speed cameras have now been ordered, one for each entrance to the village. Two are mains powered and one is solar powered. It is hoped these will be delivered and installed in February. Speeding through the village has been an issue for many years. With limited police resources and cheaper, wider range of signs available the Parish Council is now able to act. The new signs will be similar to those seen in many other villages across the country.

Planning

- (a) NE/21/01624/FUL & LBC 21 Main Street Conversion of garage to accommodation, small rear extension, and external door replacement planners' comments noted but the Council did not raise any objections.
- (b) NE/21/01823/FUL 11 Lindsey Close single storey rear extension no objection raised
- (c) NE/21/00994/FUL 2 Orchard Lane Change of use from agricultural use to mixed agricultural and equine use Permission Granted by NNC.

Allotments

The clearance of overgrown plots has progressed. There is still more work to do to finish the job and volunteers would be sought once the weather improves.

Churchyard Trees

A quote was approved for an inspection of the horse chestnuts on the boundary with St Mary's Hill. The trees were damaged in the storm before Christmas and their health and stability need assessing before further action can be agreed.

Cemetery

Council requested further engagement with Crowsons Funeral Directors with regards to the breaching of cemetery rules on removing excess spoil after burials. This has been an ongoing issue. The clerk to engage further with Crowsons, prior to invoicing a removal charge if the current pile of spoil is not removed by January 21st.

Parish Precept

At the January meeting the Council must agree the budget and set the level of income required which is then submitted to NNC for the required changes to be made to Council Tax bills in April. The Council is entirely funded from the Precept element of the Council Tax bills levied on all houses in the village

Councillors unanimously agreed a budget for 2022/23 based on the 2021/22 budget with a 4% increase to cover increasing utility costs and rising inflation. The budget would require a precept increase of £622 (£15,550 to £16,172).

I suppose all the Christmas decorations are safely away by now; after all you are reading this in February! Even so, in the Church, the Christmas/Epiphany season only really ends on 2nd February, when we remember the story of when the young child Jesus was brought to the Temple in Jerusalem by Mary and Joseph, and two faithful people, Simeon and Anna recognised this child as the long-awaited Messiah, the Light of the World. The day is called Candlemas, as on this day, traditionally, the candles for use during the year, were blessed.

On this day, or the nearest Sunday, we hold a special Candlemas service. This year the service is on 30th January you might be in time to join us at Nassington Church at 10 am that day. During the service we light candles, remembering that Jesus is the Light of the World, and after special prayers we blow out the candles, reminding ourselves that although we extinguish our candles to mark the end of the Christmas/Epiphany season, the Light of Christ is never extinguished. As we hear on Christmas Day, "the light shines in the darkness and the darkness did not overcome it". Also during this service we reflect on turning away now from the Crib to the Cross, as we are not that far away from Lent.

For me that reminds me that the new year isn't just about trying to turn away from what is wrong, to set new resolutions, but also to consider how we are sometimes called to leave behind good things as out life changes and moves on. Perhaps this might be a change of home or job, moving from education to employment, or retirement, or moving nearer to family, or perhaps into more sheltered accommodation. We face many changes in our lives when we find we are moving from good things to something new. That isn't always easy – staying with the wonderfully comforting Christmas stories might feel easier than preparing to hear again the stories of Jesus' self-giving on the Cross. However, we are called to discover new things, to venture on, taking with us what we have learned that strengthens us for new challenges. Whatever the rest of this year holds for you, may you know the Light of Jesus guiding you and comforting you.
