During the financial year ended 31 March 2022, this authority's internal auditor acting independently and on the basis of an assessment of risk, carried out a selective assessment of compliance with the relevant procedures and controls in operation and obtained appropriate evidence from the authority.

The internal audit for 2021/22 has been carried out in accordance with this authority's needs and planned coverage. On the basis of the findings in the areas examined, the internal audit conclusions are summarised in this table. Internal audit is the periodic independent review of a council's internal controls resulting in an assurance report designed to improve the effectiveness and efficiency of the activities and operating procedures under the council's control. Managing the council's internal controls should be a day-to-day function of the council through its staff and management and not left for internal audit. It would be incorrect to view internal audit as the detailed inspection of all records and transactions of a council in order to detect error or fraud. This report is based on the evidence made available to me and consequently the report is limited to those matters set out below.

The council is required to take appropriate action on all matters raised in reports from internal and external audit and to respond to matters brought to its attention by internal and external audit. Failure to take appropriate action may lead to a qualified audit opinion.

To the Chairman of the Council:

I recently carried out an Internal Audit of the Governance and financial activities of Woodnewton Parish Council. Initially I examined minutes and policies available on the website, which is well maintained and up to date. I then carried out a Zoom meeting with the Clerk/RFO Amy Miller, and thank her for time and assistance.

Upon examination of accounting records, due process, risk management, budget, payroll, asset control and other operating procedures, it is very clear that every effort is made to ensure the Council in accordance with proper practices. I found no issues to report, so I am happy to sign off the objectives on the Internal Report of the AGAR and attach same.

I would like to note for any observers, that the Council approved the AGAR first in April, but this was on the incorrect form, so the correct forms will again be presented at the May meeting.


