Parish Council Report - June 2023

The Parish Council met on 6th June 2023.

Public Time

A member of the public attended to discuss a planning application. The application was discussed during the meeting. A constructive discussion allowed for a satisfactory resolution to be found.

Churchyard

The amended regime for the re-wilding has now commenced with the graves at the back of the Church being cut and access to those graves improved, with compensating areas left to grow.

Speeding in and through the Village

Temporary 30mph signs have been installed on Main Street for the school holiday period.

Playing Field

The annual external playground safety inspection report was carried out in June.

Allotments

Cllr Goodall reported that one of the taps was faulty and required repair. It was also noted that a very small number of allotments were not being maintained to the normal standard. Tenants are reminded of the requirement to maintain their plot, and if they need help, and/or want to give up their plot to contact the Parish Council at the earliest opportunity so that people on the wating list can take it on.

Coronation Orchard

The area has been sprayed off and the rubbish from the plot clearance been burnt. The next stage is to clear the ground of all the old roots etc so that tree planting can start in the autumn.

Fly-tipping

Cllr Swallow noted the increase in fly-tipping around the village roads over the last month. Tipping on verges and public land can be reported to NNC who will clear it up. Please see elsewhere in the magazine for the relevant website. If you see anyone fly-tipping, please do not approach them, but take as many details as possible of the people and vehicle and report via NNC website.

Old School House

Council noted the Vicar's article in last month's newsletter and will be happy to engage in any way when the time arises.

Coronation Plaque

A handmade commemorative plaque made by a village resident and fired in the pottery has been donated to the village. A suitable location will be found. The Council recorded their thanks to the resident for their kind gesture.

Log-in details from Rev. Jane


