Parish Council Report - July 2023

The Parish Council met on 3rd July 2023

Public Time

No members of the public attended.

Churchyard

Cllr Phythian will liaise with contractors to ensure that a cut delayed from earlier in the year will take place in September. The end of year cut of the rewilding areas will need to be carried out with a scythe mower and the timing and equipment for this will also be agreed with the contractors.

Speed Cameras

Cllr. Blackmore reported that all cameras were working well.

Playing Field

The monthly playground report was carried out by Cllr Guttridge. There were a few jobs which would be discussed and added to the village clean-up day in the autumn.

- (e) NE/23/00500/FUL 1 Orchard Lane planning amendment No Objection
- (f) NE/23/00193/FUL 8 St Mary's Hill extension Refused
- (g) It was AGREED by all the current process for Extraordinary Meetings called to discuss planning applications in the village that require commenting on between meeting dates was in line with statute. However, as well as being posted on the notice board the notice would also be posted on the community chat to increase awareness.

Allotments

A request to add a shed to one of the allotments was approved.

The allotment rents will be circulated in September with those who wish to give up their allotments at this time to contact the clerk – there is a waiting list.

The rent for an allotment has been increased to £20 per year to be paid by bank transfer. Various works had been carried out on taps etc and all were now fully working.

A local farmer will be asked for help with clearance of the Coronation Fruit Orchard with a view to planting in the late Autumn.

Roads & Footpaths

The Council has contacted Highways regarding the sub-standard reinstatement of the road following utility works in Main Street

A couple of months ago we had a similar service of thanksgiving for the ministries of Revd. Peter Konig as Associate Priest in the Benefice and Jan Downey as our Reader. Peter and his wife, Anne, have now moved to Scotland and Jan has retired from her Reader ministry and is now Reader Emeritus.

We give thanks to God for the faithful service of these three within the Benefice for so many years. Each had, and still have, a unique place in our life together, supported by their families and those nearest to them. It is perhaps too easy to forget that none of us operate in a vacuum and those who perform a formal ministry or service are usually supported by family members "in the background" whose contributions should also be recognised. Of course this is true in a wider context as well; whatever is seen as formal service in our communities or our churches is supported by many who contribute so much "behind the scenes" and we should give thanks for all they do as well. May we all find our own ways of contributing to the life and well-being of our communities, our families and our churches, whether that is "front of house" or "behind the scenes". Whatever we do is all of equal value and is much needed!

ART FOR WILDLIFE

Well we said we would be back and here we are.

First let me say a big thank you for your support of the Big Life affordable art fair that took place in Woodnewton Village Hall last year. This event raised over £450 for the charity and gave people the chance to see and purchase some beautiful items from a variety of talented artists.

If you missed last year's event don't worry, as we are back again this year albeit in a different location and for a longer period of time. For those of you who are wondering what I am on about and what Big Life is, here is a quick synopsis.



Big Life was founded in September 2010 by photographer Nick Brandt, conservationist Richard Bonham and entrepreneur Tom Hill to address the dramatic escalation of poaching in East Africa. Since its inception, Big Life has expanded to employ hundreds of local Maasai rangers -with permanent outposts, tent-based field units, patrol vehicles, tracker dogs and planes for aerial surveillance. As a result Big Life has dramatically reduced poaching of all wildlife in the Amboseli-Tsavo-Kilimanjaro ecosystem. To learn more visit the website at biglife.org
