Public Time

No members of the public attended.

The Parish Council met on 6th November.

Churchyard

Cllr Pythian updated that the rewilding areas have not been cut back as planned due to the recent wet weather, but this is still planned to be done. The tasks listed for attention at Clean-Up Day were completed. This will allow more sunlight to filter under the yew tree which helps to promote some of the species that are growing there.

Playing Field

Pressure washing of safety surfaces and cutting back of low branches were done as part of the Clean-Up Day. No other issues to report.


